The Democratic Republic of Congo

Bukavu, Kalemi, Uvera, Bujumbura in the country of Burundi – four major crusades in a row! Jako and Kamau have been doing routine repair work and maintenance getting the equipment and truck to leave for the DRC. We are now 80% ready. At the moment, we have urgent spares to buy and fit, and then we will be on the road again. Still one of the most important needs for this upcoming crusade season is a technical team vehicle. Our planning team will move to Eastern DRC soon after the Nkayi crusade, in order to establish a field office in Bukavu. Looking at our resources and what we have in our hands it is impossible! However, I am encouraged that God supplied what we needed for Nkayi, and He will do the same for the DRC.
